This edited collection explores the historical determinants of the rise of mass schooling and human capital accumulation based on a global, long-run perspective, focusing on a variety of countries in Europe, the Middle East, Asia, Africa and the Americas. The authors analyze the increasing importance attached to globalization as a factor in how social, institutional and economic change shapes national and regional educational trends. Although recent research in economic history has increasingly devoted more attention to global forces in shaping the institutions and fortunes of different world regions, the link and contrast between national education policies and the forces of globalization remains largely under-researched within the field. The globalization of the world economy, starting in the nineteenth century, brought about important changes that affected school policy itself, as well as the process of long-term human capital accumulation. Large migrations prompted brain drain and gain across countries, alongside rapid transformations in the sectoral composition of the economy and demand for skills. Ideas on education and schooling circulated more easily, bringing about relevant changes in public policy, while the changing political voice of winners and losers from globalization determined the path followed by public choice. Similarly, religion and the spread of missions came to play a crucial role for the rise of schooling globally.

Si aparentemente hay trazos de realismo mágico -como las andanzas del Cuique, espiando con fines puramente estéticos a todas las parejas de recién casados en el Hotel de Santa Marma de Ostuma y en la ciudad misma-, es porque los atributos insolitos de sus personajes y el contexto mixto-geográfico lo permiten. Con La noche de los anillos, Blandon, con su genio socarrón, pero serio, en el mejor estilo castizo de Cervantes, Camilo José Cela y Jardiel Poncela se inserta firmemente en la copiosa producción narrativa que ha distinguido a Nicaragua en los últimos años.

Durante su primer medio siglo de existencia, los Estados Unidos de América sufrieron un espectacular desarrollo que convirtió a la joven república en una de las naciones más poderosas del mundo. El Norte, industrial, en crecimiento, que se convertía en un imán para miles de emigrantes de todo el mundo. Y el Sur, rural, agrario, apegado a sus tradiciones y costumbres, con una economía orientada a la exportación de algodón y tabaco. Las tensiones entre los dos modos de vida se fueron agravando rápidamente, lo que generó finalmente una crisis en noviembre de 1860. Se había prendido la chispa que los llevaría a la guerra. En el conflicto -el más duro del siglo XIX, si exceptuamos las Guerras Napoleónicas, y el mayor jamás librado en el continente americano-, combatieron casi tres millones de hombres. Cerca de 620 000 morirían, más de 412 000 volverían heridos, y amplias zonas del Sur quedarían completamente devastadas, lo que generaría una brecha en el país que tardaría décadas en cerrarse.

Amnon's lust is set in the context of complementary passions of ambition and revenge, reflected in Absalom and Tamar respectively.

Latin America has experienced a profound transformation in the first two decades of the 21st century: it has been fully incorporated into the global economy, while excluding regions and populations devalued by the logic of capitalism. Technological modernization has gone hand-in-hand with the reshaping of old identities and the emergence of new ones. The transformation of Latin America has been shaped by social movements and political conflicts. The neoliberal model that dominated the first stage of the transformation induced widespread inequality and poverty, and triggered social

explosions that led to its own collapse. A new model, neo-developmentalism, emerged from these crises as national populist movements were elected to government in several countries. The more the state intervened in the economy, the more it became vulnerable to corruption, until the rampant criminal economy came to penetrate state institutions. Upper middle classes defending their privileges and citizens indignant because of corruption of the political elites revolted against the new regimes, undermining the model of neo-developmentalism. In the midst of political disaffection and public despair, new social movements, women, youth, indigenous people, workers, peasants, opened up avenues of hope against the background of darkness invading the continent. This book, written by two leading scholars of Latin America, provides a comprehensive and up-to-date account of the new Latin America that is in the process of taking shape today. It will be an indispensable text for students and scholars in Latin American Studies, sociology, politics and media and communication studies, and anyone interested in Latin America today.

Buero Vallejo is Spain's most important living playwright. His profound, innovative theatre has earned him success and respect since 1949. Each new play has been an exciting experiment with dramatic form as well as a powerful expression of a tragic view of human life and Spanish society. *A Dreamer for the People* was first performed in 1958. In this history play, the first of a remarkable series, culminating in *La detonación* (*The Shot* also published by Aris & Phillips), the dreamer of the title is the often maligned Marquis of Esquilache, the reformist minister of Carlos III. Buero sets off Esquilache's relations with the king, the aristocracy, his wife and his maidservant against a lively re-creation of the build-up to the famous 1766 Capes and Hats Revolt in the streets of Madrid. Public history and private tragedy are brought together in a complex structure, bringing into clear focus the clash between forces of change and immobility that lay at the heart of both the 18th century and the Franco period in Spain. In returning his proofs, Buero compliments the author of this first translation into English of his play: 'La version de Mr Thompson es muy cuidada y fiel, asi como acertadas y oportunas sus notas'.

The book thus contributes to a growing trend in the academic literature focusing on the subnational level of armed conflict behavior. It also illustrated how the social and economic context of these resources can operate as deterrents or as drivers of violence. The book thus provides important lessons for policymakers and scholars alike: Just as reources have been linked to outbreaks and transformations of violence, peacebuilding too need to take into account their impacts, legacies, and ponential.
