

Everton Season Scrapbook 1890 91 Anfield Champions In Blue

Drawing on research from Britain, Europe, Argentina and the USA this volume examines the culture and loyalties of soccer players and crowds and their relationships to social order, disorder and violence. creation of the club and continues until the schism in the club ranks that saw Everton move to Goodison and led to the creation of Liverpool F.C. Includes some other important early matches - first match in Football League, the cup-tie that was stricken from the record books and others. More than 70 matches covered in all, all with full period match report.

This volume offers a multidisciplinary approach to the study of language in relation to the subject of history.
