It is a good idea for you to find your dog from the table. The main reason for this is that human food is often very high in fat and not very well digested by your dog. A good Protein? t? t? d? t should be one that is very well digested, high in Carbohydrate? and low in fat. Some dogs find that they have estimated that about 10% of the fat that you find your dog - only about 10% of the energy level should come from the fat in the dog's diet.

Getting your dog's body into alkalinity is as important as getting yours balanced. Cancer cannot survive in an alkaline environment as it thrives on acid. Dogs suffer from the same mineral and vitamin deficiency as we do in our modern day diet. Switching your dog to alkaline water and putting him on a raw diet are the two major ways a dog's body can be brought into alkaline balance. You may be familiar with the alkaline diet in a human context. It is a diet designed to alter your internal pH value and, in doing so, positively impact various aspects of your health. Different parts of the human body have different pH values, but the idea behind the diet is that by replacing acid-forming foods with alkaline foods you can boost your health and prevent serious diseases like cancer. The same is true for your dog! Balancing your dog's pH will improve numerous aspects of his health. The very first alkaline diet for dogs was developed by Canine Caviar. Jeff Baker, CEO/President of Canine Caviar, says that "having an alkaline based diet

helps put more oxygen into the blood to allow the DNA's self-recovery mechanism to function more efficiently and effectively." In other words, by feeding your dog foods that are above 7.0 on the pH scale, you can sway the pH level of his urine, blood, lymph, and cerebral spinal fluid in a more alkaline direction to improve health and prevent disease. This is because the most essential organs in the body require alkalinity to function at their optimal level - this includes the heart, brain, liver, and the intestines. It mimics your dog's natural evolutionary diet - wolves ingested the organs and stomach contents in addition to muscle meat on their prey (stomach and intestines are highly alkaline). An alkaline environment in the body enables the blood to absorb more oxygen which is then transported to the tissues and organs. More oxygen in the blood means less damage from anaerobic activity - this means less muscle fatigue and slower aging. It helps prevent the development and progression of chronic illnesses that can develop into serious and life-threatening disease. Feeding your dog an alkaline diet does more than just help him maintain the proper pH balance - it also makes sure that his body is functioning at its optimal level. When your dog's body becomes too acidic, his major organs will start to suffer which can lead to a whole host of health issues. An acidic pH also increases your dog's risk for degenerative disease because it prevents oxygen from entering the blood. One of the easiest ways to boost your dog's pH back into alkalinity is to feed him an alkaline diet. Read on to learn what to look for in a dog food for pH balance.
