An appropriate diagnosis of a tumor correctly determines the necessary therapy for that patient. Objectives: Women in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs) have higher rates of cervical cancer and comparable rates of other gynecologic cancers when compared to women in high-income countries, yet the majority of LMICs have few gynecologic oncologist and lack formal training programs. The management of gynecologic cancers must be adapted to available resources and to potential differences in disease presentation and biology in LMICs.

Methods: We developed an adaptable but universal curriculum for training in low resource settings. We supported collaborations between high- or middle-income country academic gynecologic oncologists and local mentors and trainees to either launch or strengthen formal gynecologic oncology fellowships. Milestones include: progression through the curriculum, clinical training with local and international mentors, regular Project ECHO tumor boards, logging of cases and educational activities, and observerships at the international mentor's institution. Trainees sit for a final examination; those who pass are awarded a certificate of completion from IGCS.

Results: In 2019, IGCS is supporting 12 collaborative fellowships. Thirty fellows are in training, supported by 35 international mentors and 24 local mentors, and they have logged 1758 surgical procedures to date. Four major textbooks and the ACOG Prolog series have been donated to fellows. Forty-seven Project ECHO tumor boards were held in 2018; to date IGCS members have volunteered over 1500 hours to ECHO Tumor Boards for fellow training. Fellows have traveled to host institutions in North America,

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Europe and Asia, and have attended international professional society meetings.

Conclusions: The IGCS Global Curriculum is a novel model of sustained collaboration yielding academic quality, sub-specialty surgical training in resource limited settings.

Mozambique has a high prevalence of gynecologic cancers .Does not have a trained gynecologic oncologist or a formal training program in gynecologic oncology. There are challenges associated with building a new training program in this setting. The International Gynecologic Cancer Society (IGCS) Gynecologic Oncology Global Curriculum & Mentorship Program is a two-year training program to train gynecologists in gynecologic oncology in countries without a formal training program. Training includes self-study, assessments, regular in-country surgical training with IGCS international mentors who travel from Brazil and the US. The program uses the Project ECHO (Extension for Community HealthCare Outcomes),

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telementoring model for multidisciplinary monthly tumor boards. Fellows present cases and discuss management with international mentors, and receive didactic lectures and record clinical cases in REDCap, a web database application. The Mozambican fellows also travel to Brazil to learn best practices for diagnosis, and management of women with gynecologic cancers in different resource settings. Prior to this program there were limited options for surgical treatment of women with gynecologic tumors in Mozambique. Developing support and resources for a new training program in a busy hospital requires that fellows and mentors clearly explain the program and provide regular updates to supervisors, hospital and Ministry of Health leadership. The program should not adversely impact other hospital services. A senior gynecology faculty member serves as the local mentor and the three fellows in Mozambique developed strategies to work together, particularly in the operating room, to support each other. The international mentors have travelled to Mozambique 9 times and the fellows have travelled 2 times to Brazil. The training model is multidisciplinary, and it took time to engage other specialities in the patient care. The program, initiated in 2017, has matured as administrative and resource challenges have been successfully met. In February 2020 the 3 fellows are expected to complete their training and become the first gynecologic oncologist of Mozambique. This program offers a unique opportunity to build a specialty training program with support from an international society and experienced clinicians and lays the foundation to develop a training program in Mozambique. Knowledge, surgical skills and patient care has improved. Patients with gynecologic cancers can now receive appropriate care locally, including surgery.
