management and administration statistics (LEMAS), uniform crime reports (UCRs), and law enforcement agency identifiers crosswalk. The analyses in the study used an ordered regression model (ORM). Similarly, statistical analysis, crime analysis, and intelligence analysis functions are consistently associated with all of the dependent variables. However, survey analysis is significantly associated with only command-level managers' decision-making, whereas patrol strategy analysis is significantly associated with both command-level managers' and patrol officers' decision-making in the organization.
