It's proved a huge success, with hundreds of schools participating in the first year, and numbers up by 20% in the second. Coinciding with the start of the third year of competition, and published on National Poetry Day whose theme coincidentally in 2014 is Recitation, this *Poetry by Heart* anthology brings together the pool of poems - 200 altogether - from which contestants make their choices.
