Notably, he translated from the English and self-published Lewis Carroll's Alice's Adventures in Wonderland and JM Barrie's Peter Pan; or, The Boy Who Would Not Grow Up. His fantasy books featuring the YELLOW WOODPECKER GRANGE characters have been adapted to cinema, TV series, comic books, theatre, music and TV cartoons across the decades. Monteiro Lobato has influenced many generations of writers and his characters are still the most recognisable in national culture.

He twice received the Newbery Honor, was awarded the Caldecott Medal, and was the US nominee for both of the biennial international Hans Christian Andersen Awards, as a children's book

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illustrator in 1982 and a writer in 1988.

In her bestselling book *Losses and Gains*, Lya Luft draws on her own experiences of loss and gain in

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marriage and family to address the universal themes of childhood, love and maturity. She portrays love as the common thread through all phases of life. As children, the unconditional love we receive from our parents determines our expectations for all the other forms of love we experience later. And as adults, she argues, the complex task of loving another depends, initially, on self-love and self-esteem. Luft's ardent reflections on existence and the human spirit are a powerful reminder to us all: we have lost everything only when we believe we deserve less than everything still to be gained.

Para facilitar a exposição didática do conteúdo, o Livro foi dividido em três partes, • Parte I: Dos doze aos catorze anos de idade • Parte II: Dos quinze aos dezessete anos de idade • Parte III: Dos dezoito aos vinte e cinco anos de idade Além de oferecer opções diferenciadas propiciando ao leitor aperfeiçoar o relacionamento com seu filho adolescente, o Livro ainda oferece um capítulo todo direcionado para o jovem, que enfrenta o desafio de ingressar no mercado de trabalho, pela primeira vez. Neste capítulo (XXI), o leitor encontrará muitas dicas para facilitar a busca e o sucesso profissional, que também é uma preocupação dos pais, quando o filho chega nessa fase. Por fim, a obra propõe uma ampliação na visão dos pais a respeito de todas as fases que compõem a adolescência. Exemplifica as nuances dos 12 aos 25 anos de idade e habilita mães e pais a lidarem com cada fase, adotando tratamento diferenciado e maior controle da situação.
