In the sixteenth century hundreds of thousands of indios—indigenous peoples from the territories of the Spanish empire—were enslaved and relocated throughout the Iberian world. Although various laws and decrees outlawed indio enslavement, several loopholes allowed the practice to continue. In *Global Indios* Nancy E. van Deusen documents the more than one hundred lawsuits between 1530 and 1585 that indio slaves living in Castile brought to the Spanish courts to secure their freedom. Because plaintiffs had to prove their indio-ness in a Spanish imperial context, these lawsuits reveal the difficulties of determining who was an indio and who was not—especially since it was an all-encompassing construct connoting subservience and political personhood and at times could refer to people from Mexico, Peru, or South or East Asia. Van Deusen demonstrates that the categories of free and slave were often not easily defined, and she forces a rethinking of the meaning of indio in ways that emphasize the need to situate colonial Spanish American indigenous subjects in a global context.

O fim da Ditadura Militar (1964-1985), no Brasil, pôs fim à censura? Que interferências

a Geografia Escolar estaria sofrendo nos dias de hoje? Em que medida o Currículo Oficial e o Programa Nacional do Livro Didático (PNLD) continuam a impor o poder do Estado na seleção dos conteúdos educacionais? Em favor de quem? E os múltiplos atores sociais – professores, pais de alunos, autores de livros didáticos, editores, mídia, mercado editorial – de que forma estariam interferindo nos temas e métodos tratados por essa disciplina escolar? As complexidades impostas por uma sociedade cada vez mais globalizada, interconectada e informacional no tocante à censura, à interdição e ao cerceamento aos conteúdos e métodos contidos nos livros didáticos de Geografia estão no centro deste debate. Em que medida as avaliações do PNLD não estabelecem um cerceamento da liberdade de expressão e representam uma interferência autocrática do Estado na formulação dos conteúdos e métodos? Por outro lado, o mercado também atua no controle dessas produções didáticas, por exemplo, nas restrições impostas pelas necessidades de lucro do mercado editorial e, principalmente, na ostensiva interferência dos meios de comunicação que promovem um "patrulhamento" ideológico dos programas educacionais. Daí surge o objeto de análise central deste livro, escrito pelo professor da Universidade Federal de Alfenas (MG) Márcio Vitiello, que é o de avaliar de que forma o Estado, as mídias e os diferentes atores sociais de fato interferem – e até mesmo promovem – a censura nos conteúdos e métodos expressos nos livros didáticos e, conseqüentemente, nos conteúdos da Geografia Escolar brasileira nas primeiras décadas do século XXI.

O livro didático nos dias atuais é visto como instrumento passível de muitos erros, porém, também é dado como instrumento indispensável à prática pedagógica. Ao longo de sua história, o livro didático vai ganhando cada vez mais importância na sala de aula, mas também, vai acumulando falhas e defeitos. Deste modo, este livro tem como roteiro trabalhar o percurso histórico das políticas voltadas a educação e ao livro didático, trabalhar o percurso do desenvolvimento do currículo escolar da ciência História, trabalhar a atual política educacional e do livro didático, trabalhar as atuais propostas curriculares, além de trabalhar os atuais problemas apresentados pelos livros didáticos, apresentando propostas de práticas pedagógicas. Vamos notar que os problemas apresentados pelos livros didáticos, são problemas que vêm de muito tempo. Desde a necessidade da criação de um currículo escolar, os conteúdos de História nos livros didáticos acumularam erros como influência ideológica, fatos dados como prontos e acabados, visão unilateral dos conteúdos, dados preconceituosos, ausência de reflexão e senso crítico, entre outros. Esta obra oriunda de uma pesquisa acadêmica, ainda tem como objetivo aconselhar algumas práticas pedagógicas que possam contornar ou mesmo explorar os defeitos dos livros didáticos, afim de, passar uma educação e conhecimento de qualidade da ciência História.

Joy is an experience of reunion or fulfilment, of desire at least temporarily laid to rest, of a good thing that comes to pass or seems sure to happen soon. In this wide-ranging and highly original book Adam Potkay explores the concept of joy, distinguishing it from

Os lusitanos não prescindiram da nacionalidade, mas usaram os diplomas legais a partir de suas experiências, nexos necessários para se sentirem cidadãos: os direitos destes estavam vinculados ao pertencimento e se faziam no espaço público como local de igualdade. A obra mostra os meandros da imigração portuguesa, revelando diversos ângulos e facetas ainda pouco conhecidos pelo público brasileiro.

McDonald's founder Ray Kroc once said, "It requires a certain kind of mind to see beauty in a hamburger bun." The hamburger has been a staple of American culture for the last century, both a source of gluttonous joy and a recurrent obstacle to healthy eating. Now the full beauty of the burger in all its forms is explored in *Hamburger*, a debut title in Reaktion Books' new Edible series. Andrew F. Smith traces the trajectory of hamburger history, from its humble beginnings as a nineteenth-century street food sold by American vendors, from which it soon spread to the menus of diners and restaurants. At the same time, burgers were making inroads in American culture, as well as becoming a rich symbol in paintings, television, and movies. Smith also discusses the darker nutritional, economic, and cultural conflicts raised by the hamburger, such as the "McDonaldization" of international cultures. A juicy and richly illustrated read, *Hamburger* will stimulate the taste buds of carnivores the world over. Muitos desafios da agenda política, econômica e social que urgia nos últimos anos do Brasil na condição colonial e dos primeiros como país independente atravessaram dois séculos sem solução, e aquela agenda ainda reverbera ruidosamente nos dias atuais.

Many are material, related to environmental and climatic alteration, to the domestication of livestock and development of agriculture, to technology, to disease, and to variations in human immunity, reproduction, and physiology. Others are social and cultural, touching upon issues of migration, trade, language development and differentiation, institutions of enslavement and of freedom, traditions of marriage and child-rearing, the emergence of large-scale political organization from early kingdoms to vast empires, republics and federations, and the management of war and peace. To deal with such challenging issues, global historians draw upon new techniques of analysis and comparison. But they also continue venerable traditions, inherited from the

earliest civilizations, of narrating the past on the most comprehensive and significant scale possible. This book examines the long search for an integrated human story, and particularly the points at which rapid changes of philosophy and perspective in the twentieth century transformed the historical disciplines. In spring 1749, François Bonis, a medical student in Paris, found himself unexpectedly hauled off to the Bastille for distributing an “abominable poem about the king.” So began the Affair of the Fourteen, a police crackdown on ordinary citizens for unauthorized poetry recitals. Why was the official response to these poems so intense? In this captivating book, Robert Darnton follows the poems as they passed through several media: copied on scraps of paper, dictated from one person to another, memorized and declaimed to an audience. But the most effective dispersal occurred through music, when poems were sung to familiar tunes. Lyrics often referred to current events or revealed popular attitudes toward the royal court. The songs provided a running commentary on public affairs, and Darnton brilliantly traces how the lyrics fit into song cycles that carried messages through

the streets of Paris during a period of rising discontent. He uncovers a complex communication network, illuminating the way information circulated in a semi-literate society. This lucid and entertaining book reminds us of both the importance of oral exchanges in the history of communication and the power of “viral” networks long before our internet age.

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
