

Moon Rope Un Lazo A La Luna

In a rhythmic alphabet chant, all the letters race one another up the coconut tree.

Short, easy to read rhymes reveal what is unique about various animals, from ape to wolf.

Here he describes and explains the technical aspects of this dangerous ritual and "the emotional and spiritual intensity and pure classic beauty that can be produced by a man, an animal, and a piece of scarlet serge draped on a stick." Seen through his eyes, bullfighting becomes a richly choreographed ballet, with performers who range from awkward amateurs to masters of great elegance and cunning. A fascinating look at the history and grandeur of bullfighting, *Death in the Afternoon* is also a deeper contemplation of the nature of cowardice and bravery, sport and tragedy, and is enlivened throughout by Hemingway's sharp commentary on life and literature.

A uniquely important book in the canon of the North American revolutionary left and anticolonial movements, *Settlers* was first published in the 1980s. This new edition includes a new essay and an interview with author J. Sakai by Ernesto Aguilar.
