Since the publication of New Practical Chinese Reader in 2002, it has been well-received by teachers and learners. In contrast to its first edition, the notes of the texts are designed next to each text to facilitate students. The 12 lessons in it center around a few international students, telling interesting stories about their life and friendship in China and introducing some real-life conventions concerning Chinese expression and comprehension. An MP3 disk goes with the book, including the recording of texts, new words, key sentences and conversation practices in it. This is the first systematic study of modern China's military campaigns and the actual fighting conducted by the People's Liberation Army since the founding of the People's Republic.
