Did the Thatcher years and their aftermath constitute a revolution or a restoration in education. Do they represent a  
departure from, or a reinforcement of tradition? Contemporary Debates in Education is a thought-provoking volume which  
reviews the reforms of the eighties and early nineties, then follow this with an examination of the long-standing issues in  
education over the last century in order to relate current reforms and changes to their broader historical background, so  
that those with a general or professional interest in education can better understand the process in which they are  
involved.

When first published this book was one of the first collections of empirical research in the area of the knowledge  
transmitted in schools and the responses of students to it. It includes studies of the histories of particular school subjects  
and of how the knowledge they embody is presented in the classroom. Attention is also given to the effects of gender  
stereotypes among teachers and pupils, both on pupils' selection of courses to study and on their reactions to particular  
subjects in the classroom. The other major topic in this collection is the way external examinations shape the nature of  
the school curriculum and how it is taught. There are studies of how pupils and teachers adapt to the exam system, and  
of how that system and its role in the accountability of schools, have changed in recent years. The articles collected here  
throw into relief important aspects of what is taught in schools, and they do this on the basis of a solid foundation of  
empirical research.

Includes chapters on key aspects of second language assessment such as test construct, diagnosis, exam design, and the  
growing range of public policy, social and ethical issues. Each of the contributors is an expert in their area; some are established  
names while others are talented newcomers to the field. The chapters present new research or perspectives on traditional  
concerns such as test quality; fairness and bias; the testing of different language skills; the needs of different groups of examinees,  
including English language learners who need to take content tests in English; and the use of language assessments for gate-

keeping purposes. The volume demonstrates how language assessment is informed by and engages with neighbouring areas of applied linguistics such as technology and language corpora. The book represents the best of current practice in second language assessment and, as a one volume reference, will be invaluable to students and researchers looking for material that extends their understanding of the field.

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THE REAL WORLD OF MATHEMATICS, SCIENCE, AND TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION In this Preface, I would like to focus on what I mean by "education" and speak about the models and metaphors that are used when people talk, write, and act in the domain of education. We need to look at the assumptions and processes that the models and metaphors implicitly and explicitly contain. I feel we should explore whether there is a specific thrust to mathematics education in the here and now, and be very practical about it. For me education is the enhancement of knowledge and understanding, and there is a strong and unbreakable link between the two. There seems little point in acquiring knowledge without understanding its meaning. Nor is it enough to gain a deep understanding of problems without gaining the appropriate knowledge to work for their solution. Thus knowledge and understanding are each necessary conditions for the process of education, but only when they are linked will the process bear fruit. Only in the balanced interplay of knowledge and understanding can we expect to achieve genuine education.

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
