The conventional wisdom about credit markets has been radically altered in recent years through the introduction of elements of moral hazard, adverse selection of risk, and quality-price relationships. This analysis has not been explicitly extended to informal credit markets so far, although it is widely recognized that credit transacted outside the banking circuit is quantitatively huge and qualitatively critical, especially in developing countries. This book combines the new theoretical approach to credit markets with certain precepts of the New Institutional Economics in order to analyze informal credit markets. While the formal financial institutions in developing countries carry out credit transactions within the limits set by the market environment and by government policies, informal institutions evolve by a particular selection of modes of economic behavior which are responses to intrinsic imperfections of the market. The informal sector enhances trust by making existing ties an integral component of credit contracts: the contractual component of informal credit capitalizes on the personalistic (social and economic) relationships between the transacting parties.
