The purpose of this quantitative study was to determine if basal-bolus insulin correction controls blood glucose levels more accurately than the former method of sliding-scale insulin. The design was a non-experimental, descriptive, quantitative, retrospective chart review of 164 charts. The information collected from the charts were age, gender, blood glucose level, type of insulin protocol used. The data were calculated using Chi-squared and Independent samples t-test analysis. Basal-bolus insulin correction protocols are effective in reducing incidences of hyperglycemia and hypoglycemia. The reduction in length of stay will have direct impact on reducing the increasing cost of the treatment of hospitalized patients with diabetes. Due to the impact that basal-bolus insulin correction has for patients and healthcare systems, more physicians and nurses need to improve their knowledge and use of basal-bolus correction therapy. This study revealed that basal-bolus insulin correction reduced frequency of hyperglycemia and hypoglycemia. The study also showed that length of stay was significantly reduced for patients receiving basal-bolus insulin therapy. Reduction in length of stay will have direct impact in decreasing cost for patients with diabetes. Lastly, using basal-bolus insulin therapy and controlling blood glucose levels has the potential to improve the quality of life for patients with a diagnosis of diabetes.
