A few hours later, Amanda wasn't back home. Her father, Rick Greenwell, began getting worried. He walked towards the pay phone, but his daughter wasn't there, so he walked around the trailer park looking for her. She was nowhere to be found. He called the police and reported Amanda missing. A search party was assembled, and neighbors and family members scoured the area looking for her. Police initially suspected that Amanda had run away, but this theory was soon dropped when it was clear that no one had seen or heard from her - not friends, neighbors, or other family members. For weeks, the searches turned up nothing. Investigators put on the case interviewed the residents of the trailer park, including a man who called himself John Paul Chapman. No one stood out as a suspect. Investigators soon hit a dead end. What they didn't know was that John Paul Chapman was formerly known as Jeremy Jones...a smooth talking manipulator who had committed numerous crimes...and was now known as a serial killer.

This book provides an in-depth examination of serial murderers and their victims, that include the profiles of some of the most prominent murderers of our time. The author addresses various serial killer types: Organized and unorganized, men, women, doctors, and unsolved murder cases. The case went cold for three decades until it was finally solved. In January 1997, Herbert Blitzstein was found murdered in the living room of his Las Vegas townhouse. Now, Blitzstein had been dispatched gangland style—by three bullets to the back of the head—in what appeared to be a classic contract killing. A collection of True Crime tales headlined by the story of Jeffrey Mailhot. Jeffrey Mailhot has been added to this long list of serial killers. Jeffrey was a man with no criminal record, until he was arrested and charged with the murders of several Rhode Island Prostitutes. The Woonsocket police believed that there was a serial killer preying on the city's prostitutes from the early 90's. It wasn't until the year 2004 this notion became an investigation; three women had gone missing between a seventeen-month period. According to Sergeant Steve Nowak "They had just disappeared. We had no clue. No suspects. They just kind of vanished. So it was always in the back of your mind." In previous cases police were able to pin down sporadic deaths as single isolated cases. Prostitutes and drug dealers would become victims because of their own life-styles, they lived their lives in risk. At first Audrey Harris, Christine Dumont, and Stacie Goulet were thought to be victims of their own lifestyles. Although these three women walked the street at night they fell victim to Jeffrey Mailhot, because he believed no one would miss the "troubled" women who sold themselves on the streets. Jeffrey Mailhot's fatal mistake was the fact that each of these women were loved deeply by their families.

On June 26, 2007, at 12:49 a.m., a guard patrolling Nashville's main layby truck stop on Interstate 24 stumbled upon a gruesome scene. He immediately called authorities, and Detective Sergeant Pat Postiglione arrived first at the scene. Making his way to the back of the truck stop, the detective did not miss the naked body of a young woman lying on the ground. The body was displayed with the legs spread wide, the soles pushed together. The arms were positioned upward, and the bullet hole on the woman's head quickly provided detectives with a likely cause of death. As his eyes took in the details of the scene, Postiglione quickly realized that the killer was no amateur...One that would repeat the same crime, over and over and over again....

A true crime anthology headlined by Patty Colombo. Patricia Colombo and Frank DeLuca were arrested for the brutal murders Colombo's parents and brother in Elk Grove, Illinois. Twenty-year-old Colombo had been kicked out of her parent's home two years earlier and began living with DeLuca, her thirty-six year old married boss. The pair later killed her parents under the belief that they would receive an inheritance but Patty had been written out of the will years earlier.

When the ingredients of a recipe are mixed together, and put on the hob to boil, different flavours bubble to the surface. The horror filled dish that is Samuel Little has only recently - in November of 2018, in fact - started to reveal its full range of unpleasant attacks on our senses. The essence of what is starting to emerge may well change over the coming weeks and months; it might get stronger and even less palatable, it may turn out to be a false concoction which, with investigation, proves to still contain a bitter taste. One still unbelievably bad to those who have had the misfortune to find it on their plate, but (at least) something about which we already know. Because, if there is even a fraction of truth in what Samuel Little is currently saying, the United States is about to

know the identity of its latest, biggest ever, serial killer.

AN ANTHOLOGY OF TRUE CRIME It was September 14th 2015 when Jack Taylor, a 25 year old gay man was found dead in St Margaret's church in East London. 'If that's where Jack's been found, someone's put him there, ' said Jack's sister, Jen. 'The Police could have put a stop to it, and Jack would still have been here.' Three previous murders had been committed in 2014. In each case, a body was found within a short distance of the others - sometimes in the exact same spot. Yet police assumed there was no connection between the crimes. It was only after the discovery of Jack's body that investigators realised they had a serial killer on their hands. Earlier that month, Jack made contact with the man who would go on to poison him on the gay dating site, Grindr. That person was Stephen Port, a forty year old Chef who lived in Barking, East London. When Jack went missing, his family were in an immediate panic. 'We were all trying to get hold of him, explained Jen. 'We were chasing up his friends.' We will see later that the Metropolitan Police really do not come out well in the entire case of Stephen Port. Two weeks after he was found, Jack's family were still pestering police for more information. Finally, some CCTV footage they had was shared. It showed Jack meeting up with an older man. It was the early hours of the morning, an unusual time to meet a friend. The older man in the footage was, of course, Stephen Port.

In the "Grim Sleeper" Parker describes the brutal crimes of Lonnie Franklin, Jr. who over a 23-year killing career, took a fourteen-year hiatus (thus his nickname) before resuming his murders of women in Los Angeles. Katherine Ramsland in "The Babysitter" brings us up to date on the still unsolved horrific 1976 mutilation child murders in Detroit that inspired Bill Connington's one-man Broadway play and Joyce Carol Oates 1995 novella *Zombie*. In "Really! The Other Guy Did It." Ramsland explores the bizarre case of serial killer Douglas Perry who after killing several women underwent a transsexual change into a woman, Donna Perry, who when apprehended, claimed the murders were perpetrated by his former male self who no longer existed. Ramsland asks, "Is guilt in the body or the soul?" Michael Newton in "Bad Medicine" and "Angel of Death" describes two serial killers where we least expect them: health care workers. In "The Mum Who Killed for Kicks" Perrini looks at the recent case of Joanne Dennehy, a mother of a thirteen-year old who inexplicably went on a thrill kill serial killing spree in which she tortured and murdered three men with a knife and attempted to kill two others. Kelly Banaski, a newcomer to true crime writing, brings us "Stripped of his medals and female panties", the strange case of a Canadian air force base commander, a colonel who piloted senior government officials and even the Queen of England, who suddenly began to commit a series of panty fetish burglaries that eventually escalated to horrific rape-torture murders of women.
