The responsibility of an armor bearer and a handmaiden is great and the journey is filled with experiences that will help reveal to you the great person that you already are. If you are willing to be great on a small stage, playing a minor role then watch to see what God will do through you on a big stage, playing a major role. Remember your promotion does not come from a man, it comes from God Himself.

There exists a deep tension between the biblical view of servant leaders and the status that Christian leaders today often desire and pursue. Many pastors and other church leaders, like it or not, struggle with ambition.
