Cognitive behavioral training is used to teach children with ASD to control and regulate their own actions by modifying their attitudes, self-understanding and values, based on the assumption that improvements are most likely to occur whenever a person becomes actively involved in their own behaviour. Neurofeedback includes tracking brain activity while a person engages with computer programs created specifically to facilitate focus or other skills.
