While her beau’s declaration initially seemed unusual, even antiquated, Stephanie accepted the challenge and got to work. Soon, Stephanie found her cooking and her relationship under the harsh glare of the spotlight. From culinary twists on peanut butter and jelly to “Not Your Mother’s Roast Beef” spicy French Dip to Chicken and Waffle BLTs, Stephanie shares the creations—including wraps, burritos, paninis, and burgers—that ultimately sated E’s palate and won his heart. Part recipe book, part girl-meets-boy memoir, *300 Sandwiches* teaches us that true love always wins out—one delicious bite at a time.
